DAVID PASTOR

David Pastor began his musical studies in 1983 at the Santa Cecilia de Sedaví Musical Association. Since then, he has studied under the excellent trumpeter and pedagogue Manuel López, from whom he has acquired extensive technical and practical knowledge in trumpet performance, both in classical and modern styles.

Pastor has performed and recorded with artists such as Presuntos Implicados, Sole Giménez, Michael Bublé, Armando Manzanero, Celia Cruz, Lucrecia, Martirio, Miguel Poveda, Santiago Auserón, Seguridad Social, Lolita, Jaime Urrutia, and Fundación Tony Manero. He frequently collaborates with prominent jazz musicians in Spain, including Perico Sambeat, Ximo Tébar, Mario Rossy, Eladio Reinón, Joan Soler, Jordi Vilá, Fabio Miano, and the Sedajazz Big Band. He has also played with international artists such as Clark Terry, Chris Cheek, Mike Mossman, Steve Marcus, Richie Cole, Jack Walrath, Dennis Rowland, Paquito D'Rivera, Frank Wess, Bobby Shew, Slide Hampton, Pat Metheny, Bob Mintzer, Danilo Pérez, Giovanni Hidalgo, and Donald Harrison, among many others. His versatile training has led him to perform with numerous ensembles and orchestras such as the National Chamber Orchestra of Moldova, Grup de Metalls of the CSMM of Barcelona, JerezTexas, Sedajazz Latin Ensemble, and the Thessaloniki Symphony Orchestra.

Pastor's remarkable talent as an instrumentalist has made him a point of reference for trumpeters in both modern and classical music, as well as in the world of wind bands. He actively collaborates with various musical associations and renowned orchestras such as the OBC (Symphony Orchestra of Barcelona and National of Catalonia) and the Orchestra of Valencia. David has also participated in film soundtracks such as El nom (music by Xavier Capellas), La Librería and Robot Dreams (music by Alfonso de Vilallonga), and És a l'aire (music by David Pastor).

Pastor has performed at prestigious jazz festivals including Montreal (Canada), Montreux (Switzerland), Eurojazz (Mexico), Cully (Switzerland), the Salvador de Bahia Cultural Market (Brazil), the Cancun International Music Festival (Mexico), as well as festivals in San Sebastián, San Javier, Terrassa, Madrid, and Barcelona. A highlight of his recording career was in April 1997 in Lausanne (Switzerland) for BMG with the group Solar Sides, with whom he went on a world tour, performing at leading jazz and electronic music festivals. He also took part in the recording of a monographic LP dedicated to Maurice Ravel with the Gran Canaria Philharmonic Orchestra. He contributed to RITMO—The Chick Corea Symphony Tribute, which was nominated for a Grammy Award for Best Jazz Ensemble Album and a Latin Grammy Award for Best Instrumental Album.

He is currently a professor at Taller de Músics and the Escola Superior d'Estudis Musicals Barcelona, and the director of the "Original Jazz Orchestra" of the Taller de Músics. Pastor is also a professor at the Jazz Training Workshop and the director of the UJI Big Band (Universitat Jaume I) and ESMAR (Escuela Superior de Música de Alto Rendimiento – High Performance School of Music).
